About the Position

Netmisakomik Centre for Education is seeking a compassionate, dedicated, and culturally responsive **Mental Health Worker** to support the social, emotional, and mental well-being of students from Kindergarten to Grade 8. The successful candidate will work collaboratively with school staff, families, community agencies, and leadership to create a safe, supportive, and inclusive learning environment where every student can succeed.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide individual and small-group mental health support to students.
- Develop and implement strategies to promote student well-being, self-regulation, and resilience.
- Support students experiencing social, emotional, behavioural, or mental health challenges.
- Collaborate with teachers, Education Assistants, administration, and families to develop student support plans.
- Assist with crisis intervention and follow-up support when required.
- Facilitate classroom presentations and wellness initiatives focused on mental health, coping skills, healthy relationships, and emotional regulation.
- Maintain confidential student records and documentation in accordance with professional standards.
- Coordinate referrals and collaborate with community agencies and service providers.
- Participate in school meetings, case conferences, and professional development.
- Promote positive school climate initiatives and culturally relevant wellness programming.
- Support land-based and culturally grounded approaches to student wellness when appropriate.



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Qualifications

- Degree or diploma in Social Work, Psychology, Child and Youth Care, Counselling, Mental Health and Addictions, or a related field.
- Experience working with children and youth in an educational or community setting.
- Knowledge of trauma-informed, strength-based, and culturally responsive practices.
- Experience supporting Indigenous students and communities is considered a strong asset.
- Excellent communication, interpersonal, and organizational skills.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a multidisciplinary team.
- Current Standard First Aid and CPR certification (or willingness to obtain).
- Valid Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening.

- Knowledge of Indigenous culture, traditions, and community-based approaches to wellness.
- Experience facilitating social-emotional learning programs.
- Knowledge of community mental health resources and referral processes.
